

Our Site Guidelines Helping enhance your visit

Welcome – we hope you enjoy your visit: The Land Trust is a charity dedicated to managing open space for community benefit and we always look forward to welcoming visitors to our sites – whether you're here to walk, run, cycle, and picnic or take the dog for a stroll.

Keep an eye on the signs: To enhance your experience, follow the advice and guidance of signs as you make your way around our parks and green spaces (Sometime it might be necessary for us to close off areas for importance maintenance work so please bear with us).

Taking the dog for a walk: We're proud that are parks are popular venues for dog walkers; all we ask is that you keep your pets under close control and clean up after them!

Peddling your way round: Bicycles are welcome across our parks and green spaces, many of which have Sustrans cycle routes running through them. We do ask that you respect other park users by adopting sensible cycling.

Respecting the surroundings: Our parks and green spaces provide rich havens for wildlife – who don't like litter! Make sure you clear up after yourself.

Anything else we need to tell you? Please refrain from entering our waterways – you'll disturb the wildlife and put yourself in danger. We'd also advise that unfortunately horses are not permitted on our sites.
