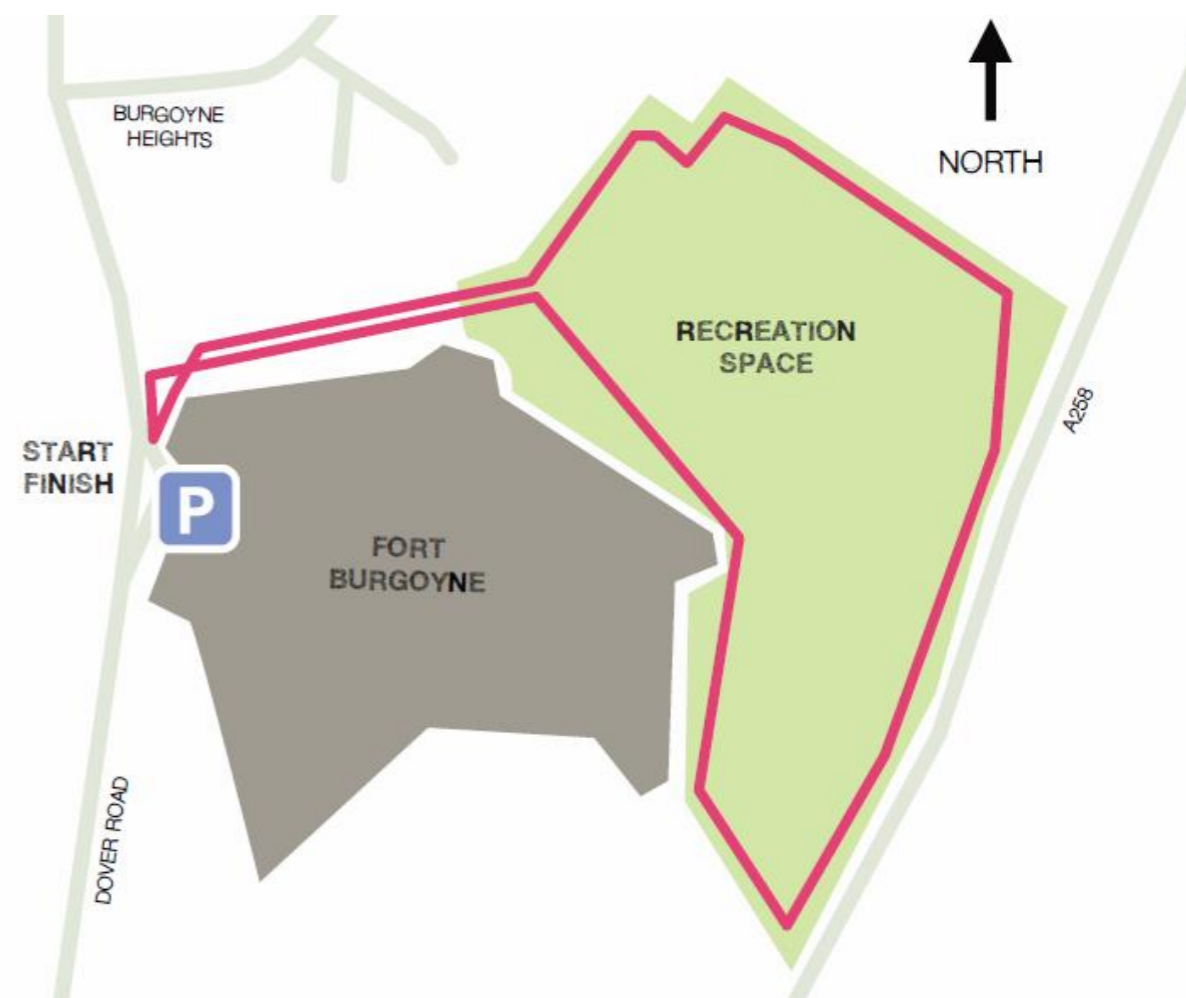


Accessibility: Some surface paths suitable for wheelchairs/buggies

Step by step walking route

Please note that the walking route is open all year round but the Fort itself is not currently open to the public.

1. Starting from the layby at Dover Road, follow the tarmac path, stopping to see the Fort over the security fence, and where the path passes parallel to the A258 look over the field gate towards Dover Castle
2. The southerly section of the walk provides excellent views across to an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and the English Channel.
3. As you return to your vehicle you may wish to cross over the road and enjoy the spectacular views across the top of Dover with its many valleys – please take care crossing this road and the boundary fences.
