## Woodland trail

### Step by step walking route

1. Walk through the main entrance and approximately 50m down the main track you will see a board on your right indicating the start of the woodland trail. Take the time to read about the trail, there are many interesting features to be found, with nature rubbing disks, mushroom wood carvings and bird feeding and viewing areas.
2. Take your time wandering around the trail looking learning about the woodland and many of its inhabitants. Keep a watchful eye out for colourful fungal blooms or in spring emerging bluebells and primrose.
3. Also take the time to listen to the noises of the woodland, the wind rushing through the trees or a woodpecker searching for its dinner. Why not stop a while at our bird feeding station and see how many of the birds on the ID guide are having their dinner.

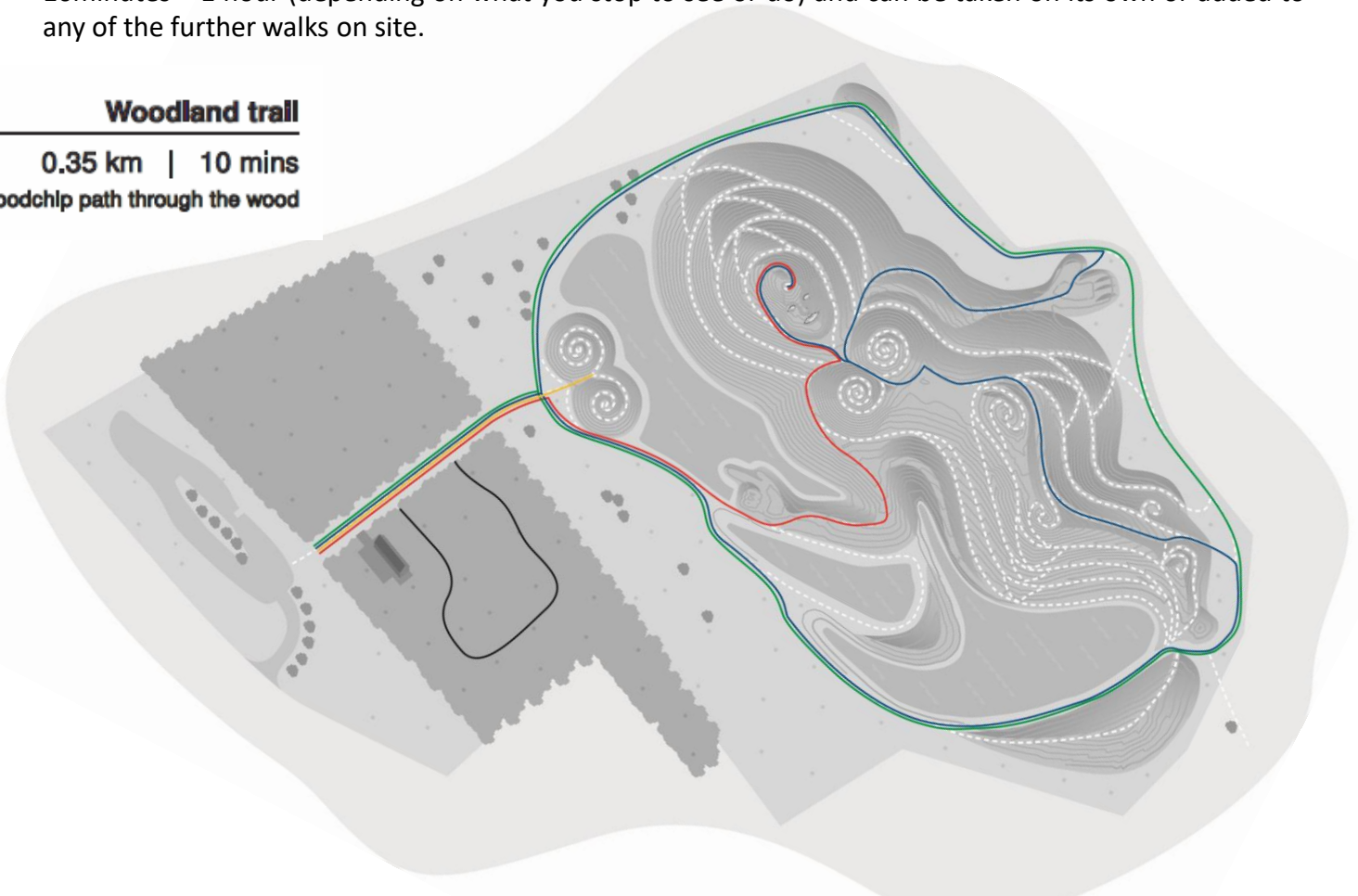
4. Make your way to the storytelling area with the castle seat and stop for a moment to discuss what you have seen or heard. Keep a look out for birds flitting in and out of the bird boxes around the woodland making nests or tending to their chicks.
5. Once you reach the main entrance path either turn head out onto the site and continue your walk on and around the sculpture or turn left to head back to the car park

This short walk through our woodland is on a woodchip path that is 350m long and should take 10 minutes – 1 hour (depending on what you stop to see or do) and can be taken on its own or added to any of the further walks on site.
