

The poppies and the bench have been carved by Paul Edwards, of Ossum Tree Carving, from a cedar tree planted approximately 100 years ago in the grounds of Plas Newton (now the Beeches) in Upton. Sadly, this tree was approaching the end of its life and had to be felled, but it now lives on helping us remember the 27 local soldiers who fell in France and Belgium during the Great War - Fallen for the Fallen.

The first 14 poppies each represent two of those men but the 15th, by the bench, represents those who came back but were affected either physically or mentally by that dreadful war. One such man was Private Geoffrey Ashe who fought as a machine gunner with the Cheshire Regiment at the Somme. He survived only four years after the war, due to injuries from the gas he inhaled whilst in action. He left behind a wife and two young children - there were thousands more like him.
