












Welcome to Bookhurst Wood

Just a short distance outside the Surrey Hills National Landscape, Bookhurst Wood is a characterful area of ancient, semi-natural woodland, perfect for a stroll in all seasons. Containing hazel coppice, oak standards, birch and willow, the woodland is home to an array of birds, insects and wildflowers.

A circular trail is waymarked around the central area of the woodland. Along the trail you will find small plaques which tell the story of the wood and its wildlife, with drawings by artist Emily Fox. There are six plaques to look out for.
