About the Role

The Land Trust owns and manages over 2,800 hectares of land across England and actively acquires new sites every year. With the introduction of mandatory Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG), the Land Trust (LT) is in an exciting period of development, with aspirations to play a leading role with the delivery of onsite and offsite BNG across England.

To assist with an increasing pipeline of projects, LT are now seeking to appoint a Senior BNG Ecologist who will work closely with the Head of Environment and Biodiversity to deliver our BNG Business Plan on existing and future sites. This is a national role that will play a part in:

- Trading > 2,400 Biodiversity Units from LT estate.
- Acquisition of onsite BNG funded by service charge or endowment.
- Acquisition of offsite BNG funded by endowment or 30 year commuted sums.
- Detailed design project related to habitat restoration over 6 sites.
- LT's potential role as a Responsible Body (subject to its application to DEFRA)
- Consultancy related to BNG on future LT sites/projects.

This exciting post will involve close working with LT colleagues, consultants, contractors, Local Planning Authorities, client partners, and external stakeholders across England.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. BNG
 - 1.1. Work with LT development team, regional Estates colleagues, our estates management subcontractors, and clients to develop, promote and deliver biodiversity projects on existing and future sites.
 - 1.2. Undertake the following tasks:
 - UKhab surveys and condition assessments
 - Write Habitat Reports
 - Populate Defra Biodiversity Metrics (all versions including statutory)
 - Write appropriate Biodiversity Management and Monitoring Plans
 - Produce or subcontract required GIS mapping
 - Monitoring reports
 - Assist the Landscape Estimator in producing appropriate cost models for delivery of biodiversity works.
 - 1.3. Produce:
 - Seeding schedules
 - Planting schedules
 - Landscape specification
 - Bill of Quantities

- 1.4. Outsource and oversee third party reports and surveys including: UKhab surveys and condition assessments, soil testing, arboriculture surveys, GIS and mapping.
- **2.** Oversee the management of LT's GIS biodiversity baseline and undertake updates and reviews, produce reports, or oversee the outsourcing of management.

3. Other Duties

- 3.1. Project manage BNG projects from enquiries through to completed transactions, with legal negotiations overseen by the Head of Environment and Biodiversity.
- 3.2. Assist the Business Development Team with acquisition of new endowment and service charge sites which include either onsite or offsite BNG.
- 3.3. Represent LT at a local, regional or national level.
- 3.4. Identify and develop new opportunities for LT to contribute to the development of relevant strategy and policy and the development of "good practice".
- 3.5. Identify and recommend new project, partnership and networking opportunities.
- 3.6. Deputise for the Head of Environment and Biodiversity when necessary.
- 3.7. Assist Head of Environment and Biodiversity with writing LT policies and/or Business Plans relating to BNG and other potential future ecosystem services and/or environmental markets
- 3.8. Become a key advocate for ecosystem services and environmental markets within LT, assisting with staff training on such topics.
- 3.9. Assist with the Policy and Outcomes Manager with LT's comments/position on environmental matters.
- 3.10. Assist with the delivery of LT's Biodiversity Environment and Ecology Strategy.

This position requires the post holder to act flexibly and undertake other duties and responsibilities commensurate with the post as directed by the Head of Environment and Biodiversity. Occasional evening and weekend working may be required, and the post holder will be required to travel as necessary to fulfil their role effectively. Post holder would be able to take Time Off in Lieu and/or make use of LT's Flexi Policy for evening and weekend working.
